TRADITIONAL MOUNTAIN ARCHITECTURE INTERPRETED IN A CONTEMPORARY WAY

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The building in Orelle, Savoie, combines traditional mountain architecture with contemporary design. A wooden volume with two gables rises from a solid base made of Luserna stone. The striking south façade with double height and a deeply recessed opening invites visitors to climb the stone staircase.

With 460 m², the building serves as a tourist office and holiday flat. The gabled roof and the open-plan interior design offer a view from the elevated road to the landscape. The walls, ceilings and roof made of

KLH® – CLT and a carbonised timber façade ensure durability and harmonious integration into the surroundings. The architecture creates a successful combination of tradition and modernity.
